Norman Tinanoff DDS, MS

Dr. Norman Tinanoff received his dental degree from the University of Maryland in 1971. After receiving his certificate and Masters Degree in Pediatric Dentistry at the University of Iowa, he spent another year at the V.A. Hospital in Iowa City in a research fellowship. Dr. Tinanoff's two-year military service was at the Army Institute of Dental Research at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. For 23 years he was at the University of Connecticut Health Center where he was director of the Pediatric Dentistry graduate program for 16 years. From 1999 to 2016 he was Chairman of the Department of Pediatric Dentistry and the Department of Health Promotion and Policy at the University of Maryland. Dr. Tinanoff has authored or co-authored over 200 publications, primarily on fluoride mechanisms, antimicrobials, caries risk factors, early childhood caries and prevention. Recent books/monographs include: "The Oral Cavity" in Nelson Textbook of Pediatrics; "Use of Fluorides", in Early Childhood Oral Health; and "Dental Caries", in Pediatric Dentistry: Infancy through Adolescence, 6e. His current interests are concerned with preventing dental caries, oral health access for underserved child populations, and developing clinical policies and guidelines for the ADA, AAPD and the IAPD.

Jennifer Kendrick MS CCC-SLP is excited about working with families and caregivers to provide fun, functional therapy to children who need increased communication skills. Jennifer has had training and clinical experience working with language delays, Apraxia, PDD, and Autism. Jennifer also works with preschool and school-aged children to assist with behavior success throughout the day at both home and school and has a particular interest in fostering positive behavior and relationships during mealtime. Jennifer has experience working with a variety of developmental, social, emotional and communicative challenges including Autism Spectrum Disorders, genetic syndromes including Down syndrome, prematurity, seizure disorders, sensory Integration issues, speech delays, bipolar, ADHD, anxiety, behavioral issues, picky eating, problem eating, and physical challenges. Jennifer has training in a variety of approaches including applied behavior analysis, Positive Discipline, sensory integration strategies, and Floor time because she realizes one size never fits all and works hard to tailor a program to the individual strengths and needs of each family she works with. Jennifer presents on a variety of topics including behavior management and inclusion strategies for daycares and preschools, parenting techniques, and mealtime behavior management. Along with Colleen Wasemann, Jennifer has developed and presents on The MPOS Method for managing mealtime challenges. Jennifer is currently completing her infant/toddler mental health specialization. In her spare time, Jennifer, her husband, and her three active and adorable boys love to spend time together creating, exploring, and discovering all that life has to offer.

Kristin Lowe DPT, PT graduated from Washington University in St. Louis School of Medicine with her Doctorate in Physical Therapy over 10 years ago. She has since worked with First Steps in two different states as well as with older children in a more traditional clinical setting. Kristin has worked with children with a wide variety of medical and developmental diagnoses including, but not limited to: developmental delays, cerebral palsy, prematurity, torticollis, Down's Syndrome, neurological conditions, rare genetic syndromes, and orthopedic concerns.
